1 RULES

The event is governed by:

2 SAFETY REGULATIONS [DP][NP] [SP]

- 2.1 Check-out and check-in:
 - 2.2.1 Before leaving to race on each scheduled racing day, each competitor shall personally sign out on the required form located next to the Race Office.
 - 2.2.2 Within the protest time limit after returning ashore, each competitor shall personally sign in on the required form located next to the Race Office.

4 RACING SCHEDULE and OFFICIAL FUNCTIONS

- 4.1 Racing will be held in a single fleet.

5 COURSES AND COURSE AREAS

- 5.1 The course areas are shown in NoR Part 1 Appendix A.

6 MARKS

- 6.1 Marks 1, 1a (offset mark), 2, 3 and 4 or associated gate marks, will be as follows:

Marks 1, 2	Mark 1a	Marks 3s/3p	Marks 4s/4p	Replacement Mark	Finishing Outer Distance Mark
ORANGE	ORANGE	YELLOW	YELLOW	RED	ORANGE

7 THE START

- 7.1 The starting line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on the race committee vessel at the starboard end and the staff displaying an orange flag on the race committee vessel at the port end.
- 7.2 To alert boats that a race or sequence of races will begin soon, the orange starting line flag will be displayed with one sound at least five minutes before a warning signal is displayed.
- 7.3 Boats whose warning signal has not been displayed shall keep well clear of boats in a starting sequence or starting, including the extensions of the starting line.



7.4 A boat starting later than 4 minutes after her starting signal will be scored Did Not Start. This changes RRS and A5.

8 THE FINISH

- 8.1 The finishing line will be between a staff displaying a blue flag on the race committee vessel and the course side of the nearby inflatable finishing mark.
- 8.2 If sailing in groups, the colour flag of each group finishing will also be displayed for the duration of its finishing window.

9 COMMUNICATIONS WITH COMPETITORS

- 9.1 When flag AP is displayed ashore, ‘1 minute’ is replaced with ‘not less than 60 minutes’ in the race signal AP.
- 9.2 [SP] No boat shall leave her berthing area ashore until Flag D is displayed. When displayed with one sound means “The warning signal will be made not less than 60 minutes after flag D is displayed, competitors may launch”.

10 CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 10.1 Any change to the intended format or schedule of races will be posted no later than 1 hour after the protest time limit, or by 2000, on the day before it will take effect, whichever is later.
- 10.2 Any change to the Sailing instructions Part 1 or 2 will be posted before 0900 on the day it will take effect.

11 HEARINGS

- 11.1 The Jury office is located at RACE VILLAGE AT ROTONDA DIAZ
- 11.2 Hearings will be held at RACE VILLAGE AT ROTONDA DIAZ

12 SCORING

- 12.1 To request correction of an alleged error in posted race or series results, a boat may complete a scoring enquiry form available online or at the Race Office.

12 OFFICIAL VESSELS

- 12.1 Official vessels will be marked as follows:

Jury/Judges	Yellow Flag with Black Letters - J
Technical Committee	White Flag with Black Letter - M
First Aid/Medical	Orange Flag
Rescue or Marshalls	White Flag with Red Letter “S” or Red Numbers
Race Committee	BLUE Flag with RED Letters - RC
Media	White Flag with Black Letter - PRESS
